Caesalpinia pulchirrima

Botanical Name: Caesalpinia pulchirrima

Common Name: Peacock Flower

Morphological characters:

The tree can rise upto 25m and its low branches form an open and spreading bush. It is a shrub growing to 3 m tall. The leaves are bipinnate, 20–40 cm long, bearing 3-10 pairs of pinnae, each with 6-10 pairs of leaflets 15–25 mm long and 10–15 mm broad. The fruit



is a pod 6–12 cm long. This exotic plant is used extensively for its extravagant, showy flowers and its incredible heat tolerance.

Growing Season and Type:

- 1. Grows well in all kinds of soil including sand, clay, loam, acidic or alkaline soils. It is highly drought tolerant but is intolerant to flooding.
- 2. This plant enjoys full sun to light shade and loves heat. Best growth and flower production is in full sun. It gets leggy in shade and blooming is reduced.
- 3. Peacock flower is drought tolerant once established, but performs best with regular irrigation while blooming.
- 4. Peacock flower is very easy to grow in alkaline to acidic, well-drained soils. This is a fast growing plant and moderately tolerant of salty conditions.
