Cyathea gigantea

Botanical Name: *Cyathea gigantea* **Common Name:** Tree fern

Moorphological Characters

A giant fern having 5-10 fronds forming a crown at the apex. Fronds are bipinnate and usually 2-3 m long. The rachis is long, dark brown to black in colour. The trunk is erect; it may be as tall as 2 meters or more with remnants of older leaf bases. The stipe is covered with dark brown and glossy scales. Sori are round forming a zig- zag row submarginally, sporangia numerous. Indusia absent.



Growing season and Type

- 1) On mountain slopes usually in dense tropical evergreen forest. Grows in moist open areas at an altitude of 600-1000 m.
- 2) The fern is reported to have free radical scavenging activity, anti-inflammatory and hepato-protective properties.
- 3) Grows in moist open areas at an altitude of 600-1000 m
