Lyonia ovalifolia

Botanical Name: Lyonia ovalifolia

Common Name: Angeri

Morphological Characters:

Oval Leaved Lyonia is a small deciduous tree growing up to 10 m tall. The tree has brown bark, peeling in narrow strips. Ovate leaves are leathery, acute or long-pointed, 8-15 cm, short-stalked. Small white flask-shaped flowers are born in almost horizontal clusters in leaf axils, 5-15 cm long. Flowers are numerous, 6-12 mm long,



constricted at the mouth and the 5 short turned-back lobes. The flowers are finely hairy.

Growing Season and Type:

- 1. Oval Leaved Lyonia is found at altitudes of 1500-3000 m.
- 2. It is Common in sunny places on hills, in scrub and on the edges of oak, pine and rhododendron woods.
- 3. Lyonia ovalifolia has its Flowering season in the month of April-June.
