## Rhododendron ciliatum

**Botanical name:** *Rhododendron ciliatum* **Common name:** Fringed Leaf Rhododendron

## **Morphological characters:**

It is a shrub that grows to 0.3–2 m in height, with leathery leaves that are elliptic or oblong-elliptic to oblong-lanceolate, 3–8 by 1.6–3.7 cm in size. The usual flower color, and perhaps the most pleasing, is white streaked with a flush of pink. It has been described as white streaked with contains three or four flowers, but the maximum is five. They are held and displayed rather loosely with a flat top. Overall the large flowers and loose truss



give a light and airy grace which goes well with the character of the plant's growth. Although described as a dwarf or semi-dwarf it certainly cannot always be called a compact plant.

## **Growing season and type:**

- 1. It is a heavy and faithful bloomer and has good heat tolerance.
- 2. Both in the wild and in cultivation, groups of plants tend to form thickets about three feet high in twenty years.
- 3. This makes a good planting in front of taller growing rhododendrons, especially those of bright color that bloom at the same time as R. ciliatum.
- 4. It appreciates plenty of moisture and good drainage, and generally tolerates a slightly higher pH than many rhododendrons.
