Ipomea fistulosa

Botanical Name: Ipomea fistulosa

Common Name: Bush morning glory, Morning glory tree bush

Morphological Characters:

Flowering accent shrub for tropical and subtropical garden. Topical looking, upright, stiff, brittle, open shrubby. Medium green, cordate to deltoid large leaves to 5 inches long with distinct petiole and prominent mid-vein, leaf margins slightly undulating; medium coarse texture. Flowers have fused petals, corolla extended, margins ruffled, white to pink, numerous terminal clusters; fruits are hairy.



Growing Season and Type:

- 1. Dormant during winter changing to rapid growth during warm season growing in a single season to 10 to 15 feet in height if allowed to growth unrestricted, multiple basal stems.
- 2. Summer heat-loving, but highly freese sensitive.
- 3. Surprisingly tolerant of alkaline soils.
- 4. It prefers Full sun.
- 5. Established plants need copious summer irrigations to maintain a vigorous look. Can be induced into a deciduous habit with extended summer drought.
