Senna auriculata

Botanical Name: Senna auriculata

Common Name: Tarwar

Morphological Characters:

Senna auriculata is a branched shrub, growing upto 1-1.5 m high. It has a smooth reddish brown bark. It has many ascending branches and 8-10 cm long pinnate leaves. There are 8-12 pairs of leaflets, each 2-3 cm long. Bright yellow flowers appear in recemes at the end of branches. The flowers are 4-5



cm across. Upper three stamens are reduced to stamenoides. Fruit is a 7-12 cm long, flat brown pod.

Growing Season and Type:

- 1. Senna auriculata is suitable for landscaping roadways and home gardens. It tolerates drought and dry conditions, but not much cold. The flowers in racemes are also attractive.
- 2. It starts flowering and fruiting at the age of 2-3 years. Once established, it flowers precociously and abundantly throughout the year.
- 3. It prefers properly dradined soil.
